


# “Show Yourself A Man”

- 1 Samuel 17
- Even though Goliath exudes everything stereotypically “manly”, he is outdone by the tender-hearted shepherd who reflects a more realistic and godly model of manliness.
- “You come to me with a sword, a spear, and a javelin, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have taunted” (17:45).

- His devotion to prayer and meditation (**Psalms 4:4, 63:6-8**).

- His zeal for the public worship of God.
