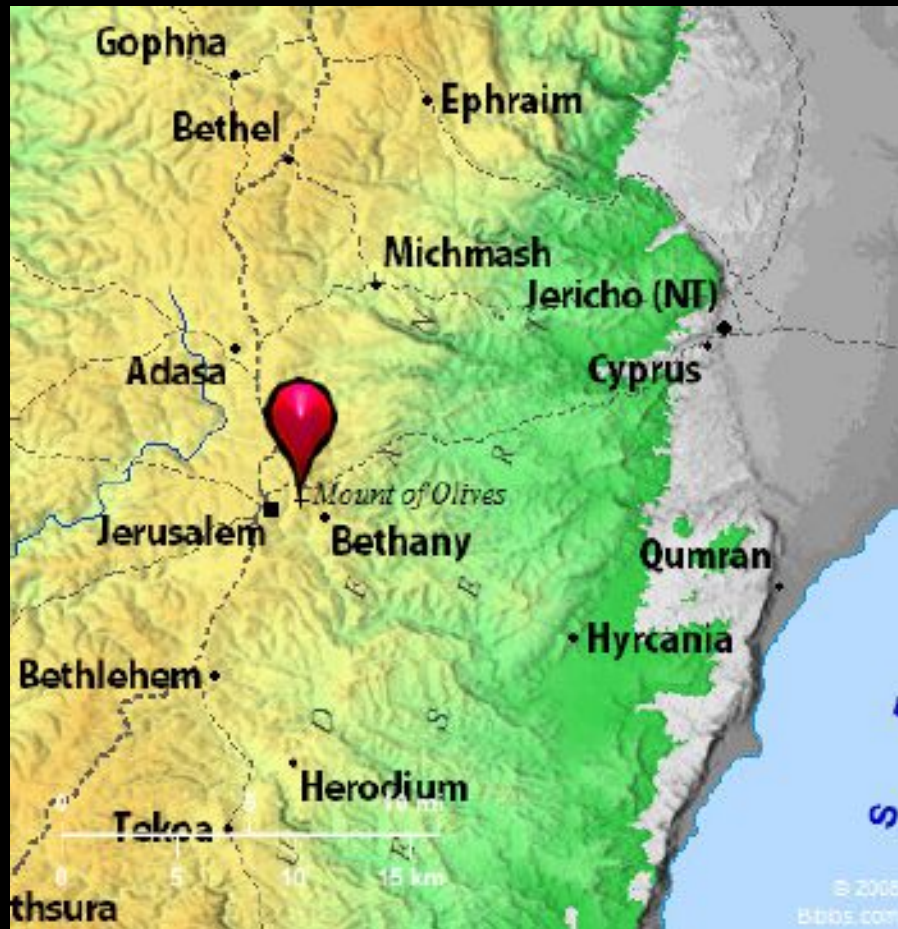
- On the east side is Bethany.

- Jesus was raised from the dead in this tomb!









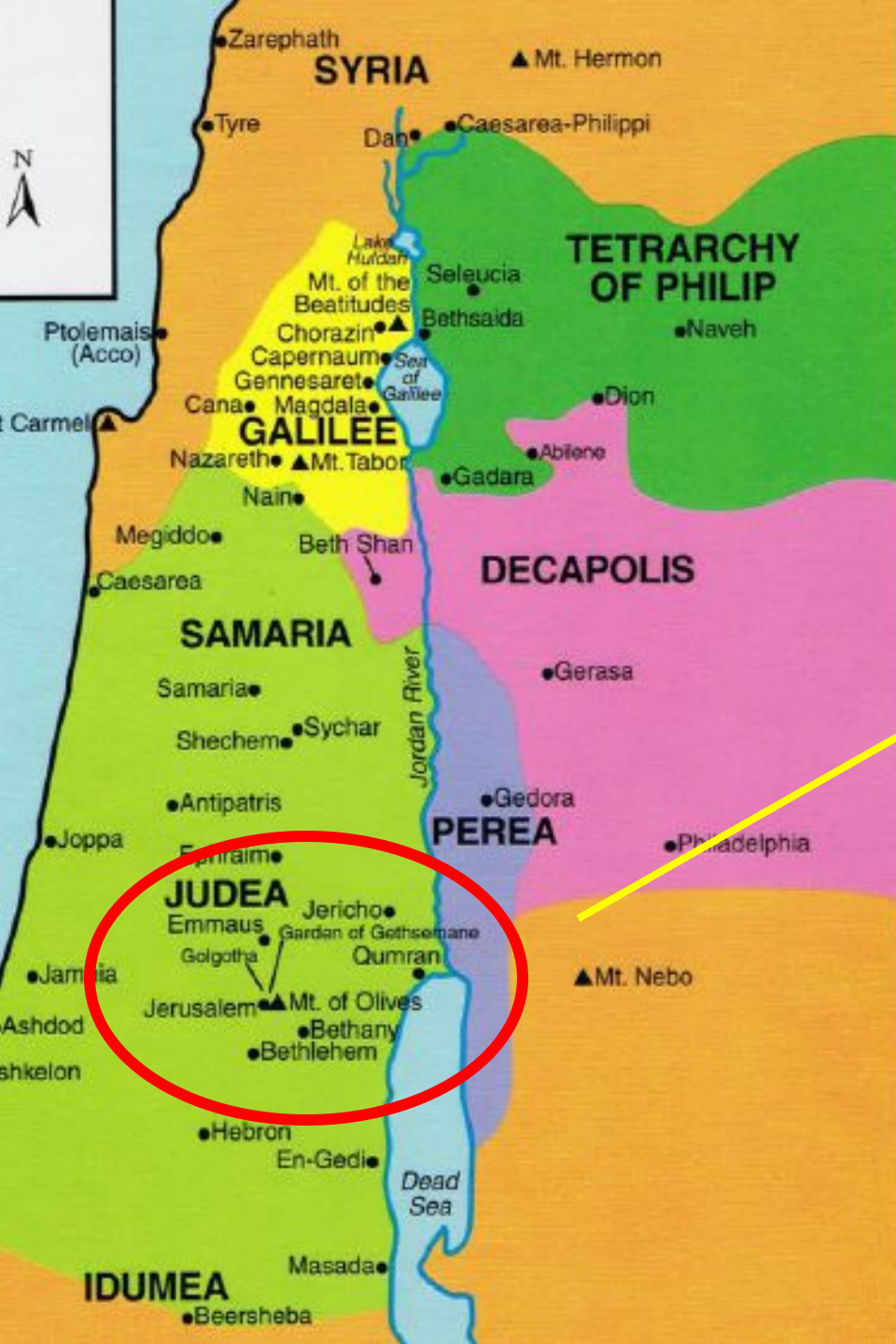
