- It sits on the west side of Israel, along the coast of the Mediterranean Sea.





- After preaching in Samaria, Philip the evangelist and his four virgin daughters took up residence (Acts 8:40; 21:8).







HEROD'S THEATER

Herod's theater, built between 22-10 B.C., was the first of its kind in Israel. Throughout the Roman and Byzantine periods the building underwent several alterations. Sometime during the 3rd or 4th c. A.D., the orchestra was converted into a large basin for staging nautical games. Apparently offended by the licentious entertainment the theater offered, the Christian Byzantine rulers closed it down in the 5th c. 




