

PARABLES OF JESUS




- Jesus tells a parable about a midnight request of a friend. This friend needs to borrow loaves of bread to feed an unexpected guest.

- "and from inside he answers and says, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been shut and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything." (vs. 7)




"I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his persistence he will get up and give him as much as he needs." (vs. 8)


- "I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his persistence he will get up and give him as much as he needs." (vs. 8)
- "So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you." (vs. 9)







- "If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?" (vs. 13)






- Cities during the Law of Moses had judges to administer justice among the people.
- This judge was not a man of God. He himself acknowledges this in verse 4.


- This judge was approached by a widow in his jurisdiction with a request. She wanted legal protection from an opponent.
