

The breba should have been there!

 The common fig tree produces two kinds of fruit each year: the breba and the standard fig.





The breba should have been there!

 The Breba always comes first (March and April). It grows when the tree is putting out its leaves (when it is not the season for figs).





The breba should have been there!

- It is edible but often ignored.
- When it doesn't grow, the standard figs won't either!





The breba should have been there!

- Since the tree had leaved out, the breba should have been there.
- Since it wasn't, that means this was a fruitless tree!
