- The Sadducees then came to Him with a question about the resurrection.

- A scribe then asked Him a question about the greatest commandment.
- Jesus posed a question to the Pharisees.
 The question had to do with David's connection to the Christ.
- After this, no one asked Him any more questions.
- Jesus praised the giving of a poor widow.
- Several parables are taught in the temple condemning the religious leaders.
