Friday

- Jesus was crucified in Golgotha between two robbers.
- Several people witnessed His death.
- He hung on the cross for six hours. During this time the Lord was mocked and insulted.
- Many miracles accompanied His death.
- Two men were converted.

Friday

- The gospel records seven statements made by Jesus while on the cross.
- Joseph recorded the Lord's body. He buried it in a new tomb. The tomb was located in a nearby garden.
- Jesus would be in the grave for three days (Friday evening to Sunday morning).
- The disciples were not expecting Him to be raised.

Friday

- Mary Magdalene and the other Mary took noticed of where Jesus was buried (Matthew 27:60-61).
- The enemies of Jesus requested permission to guard the tomb. They placed guards and a stone in front of it (Matthew 27:62-66).





Peter and John enter the tomb (John 20:3-10).

Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene (John 20:11-18).

The disciples disbelieve (Luke 24:10-12).

Jesus appears to Peter (Luke 24:34).

Jesus appears to two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35).

Jesus appears in an upper room (John 20:19-20).
