Getting Into Peter's Boat (Luke 5:1-11)

- Jesus got into Peter's boat.
- Jesus used the boat as a pulpit.
- Jesus had the boat taken into the "deep water."
- Jesus told Peter to let down his nets.
- Peter did this even though he had caught nothing the night before!
- A "great quantity of fish" were caught.

The Coin Inside the Fish (Matthew 17:24-27)

- Peter's impulsiveness is seen again here.
- This was a religious tax.
- Since Jesus was the Son of the King of the house, He was exempt from paying the tax.
- He paid it anyway not to offend those who paid.

The Coin Inside the Fish (Matthew 17:24-27)

Two miracles are on display here:

- The coin in the fish's mouth.
- Jesus already knowing about Peter's conversation.

- The Calling of Peter (Luke 5:1-11)
- Paying Taxes (Matthew 17:24-27)
- After His Resurrection (John 21:1-11)



What the miracles have in common:

- The miraculous insight of the Lord is revealed.
- The disciples fished all night long and caught nothing!
- After obeying Jesus, they caught an enormous amount!

What the miracles don't have in common:

- There was a difference in time.
- There was difference in the size of the catch.
- There was a difference in when the disciples knew it was Jesus who was speaking to them.
