Revelation Review

Chapter 12: The first great enemy is introduced! The great red dragon (the devil) is described as trying to defeat Jesus. He can't! Jesus defeats Him at Calvary and he then resorts to persecuting the people of God. At this time he used Rome, but he continues to assault God's people today (1 Peter 5:8).

Chapter 13: The devil's two henchmen are introduced. The beast from the sea (the great political power of Rome) and the beast from the earth (emperor worship) are both being used by Satan to accomplish his purposes. They both are being used to try to destroy the kingdom of God; they are waging war with God's people (verse 7).

Chapter 14: God's people will be victorious and the enemies will suffer judgment from God!

Message of the book: Christ Wins (17:14)!

- 1. Verses 1-5: The saints are pictured in victory in heaven.
- 2. Verses 6-7: The first angel comes proclaiming good tidings to mankind. He tells them to worship God because Rome's judgment has come!
- 3. Verse 8: "Fallen, fallen is Babylon the great..."
- 4. Verses 9-11: The punishment of the wicked is announced (20:10-15).
- 5. Verses 12-13: The reward of the faithful is announced!
- 6. Verses 14-20: God declares His patience with Rome to be up! Her wickedness is full. Full judgment will come upon her now!

An Interlude: The Lamb and the 144,000

Summary of the chapter:

In this chapter we learn that Rome's power is limited. She may have been powerful, but not more powerful than God! God's people may have been suffering, but God will vindicate them and bring judgment upon the empire. God saw everything that was taking place and was ready to bring down the enemies of His people.
