

THE STORY OF REVELATION

The seven seals tell us the basic story!

The seven trumpets represent God's warning.

The seven bowls represent God's full judgment!



Summary of the chapter:

In this chapter we find God about to unleash (in detail) His judgment upon the enemies of His people. We see a vision of God's people standing in victory and the seven bowls of wrath about to be poured out on the Roman Empire.

Thoughts to think about: Do you consider yourself as having "overcome?" Does this chapter motivate you to live right?

An Interlude: The Scene of Victory!

This chapter is the climax of the book. God's patience is up! Rome will be punished FULLY for her rejection of God and the persecution of His people.

This chapter is not really hard to understand. It only becomes complicated when we try to focus in on every minor detail.

When we take a step back and look at the basic story that's being told, we find one of the easiest chapters to understand in the Bible.

This chapter is strikingly similar to Revelation 8-9. The only difference is there is no more time for repentance!

The Seven Bowls of Wrath!

1. God commands the pouring out of seven bowls (vs. 1).

2. These are seven bowls of wrath (vs. 1).

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
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- 5. God avenges His people in His time (vss. 5-7).
- 6. The wicked still refused to repent after the pouring out of the first 4 bowls (vss. 8-10).

The Seven Bowls of Wrath!

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- 8. When the 5th bowl is poured out the beast's kingdom becomes darkened and men experience much pain (Revelation 16:10-11). Maybe this represents this widespread evil and corruptness throughout the empire. Regardless, the wicked still refused to repent!
- 9. When the 6th bowl is poured out, an army from the east comes through the dried up Euphrates (vs. 12).

The Battle of Armageddon (vss. 13-16):

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 Pharaoh Necho and Josiah; the Israelites' conquest of Canaan.
- In the Bible this was a place where good went against evil. In Revelation it is being used to refer to a decisive spiritual battle taking place against God and His people and Satan and his people.
