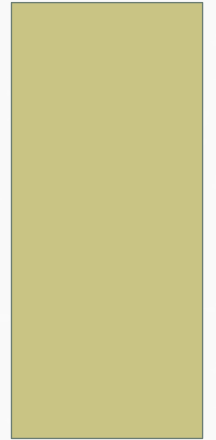


THE BOOK OF HEBREWS

JESUS' SACRIFICE IS PERFECT



TABERNACLE/TEMPLE SERVICE

- What ONE WORD would you use to sum up all the physical structure of the tabernacle (temple) and the sacrifices of the first covenant?
- **HINT** Heb 8:5
- *COPY or SHADOW*
- *What is “copied” or what is “casting a shadow”?*
- Heavenly Service in the presence of GOD (Heb 9:24)

AN EMERGING THEME...

- **Read Heb 9:9** – What problem did animal sacrifices NOT solve?
- **CONSCIENCE**
- **Read Heb 9:14** – What did the blood of Christ accomplish?
- Purge our **CONSCIOUS** of dead works
- In other words, created a good **CONSCIENCE**

THE FINAL WORD ON ANIMAL SACRIFICE (HEB 10:1-4)

For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, make those who approach perfect. For then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins. But in those sacrifices there is a reminder of sins every year. For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins.

JESUS CAME TO DO GOD'S WILL

- Hebrews 10:5-9 points to Psalm 40:6-8
- David wrote the Psalm, but who does the Hebrew author claim is speaking? When did this happen?
- God instituted animal sacrifices yet, what does this psalm say? How do you explain this?
- Jesus came to do God's will (10:7,9). By doing so, what kind of sacrifice did he become?

By that will we have been sanctified
through the offering of the body of
Jesus Christ ONCE FOR ALL.

HEB 10:10

SANCTIFIED BY THE PERFECT SACRIFICE

The Hebrew Writer sums up this discussion:

- Repeated animal sacrifices can never take away sin (vs 11)
- Jesus offered one sacrifice for sins forever (vs 12)
- Jesus sat down at God's right hand (vs 12)
- Jesus' enemies will be made His footstool (vs 13)
- Jesus' sacrifice perfected forever those being sanctified (vs 14)

Thought question: What implication is contained in verse 13 for the Hebrews (and for us)?

THE HOLY SPIRIT'S WITNESS

- Over 650 years earlier, Jeremiah 31:33-4 said by the Holy Spirit
- *“This is the covenant that **I will** make with them” ...*
- then He adds, *“Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more.”*
- Conclusion (v18): Remission of sin eliminates the need for offerings for sin (Jewish animal sacrifices)
