- When we change the scope of oversight for the elders, whose authority is usurped? Jesus, the Chief Shepherd



- No example of churchwide "relief fund"
- The pattern: give when there is need to those having need

Thought Questions

 Doesn't Acts 15 show that "church councils" can be set up to regulate a larger entity than the local church?



Acts 15 "The Jerusalem Council"

- Warned another church about false teachers
- Communicated information to another church
- Clarified their understanding of revealed truth

Autonomy does not prevent information flow between churches, but does require independent oversight
