And together, we all tearfully rejoice. Though we'll miss him deeply, he's where he has always wanted to be! Don began, "The scriptures tell of the wonders of heaven and the great joys, the river of life, the tree of life, and other blessings for the redeemed." Then he proceeded to list all the reasons "to do anything necessary to be one of those privileged to enter."
