Were The Pharisees Legalists?

- They had a set of orally-transmitted laws that they believed originated with Moses, called Halakah (Leviticus 11:44, Exodus 19:6).
- "Pharisee" means "separated/detached."
- Jesus called them out for their failure to observe the "weightier provisions of the Law (Matthew 23:23).
- Of course, it's not fair to assume that every Pharisee was just like the stereotype (Acts 15:5, Acts 23:6).

Why Did Jesus Condemn Them?

- They were condemned for blatant hypocrisy (Matthew 23:3).
- They placed their human traditions and customs ahead of scriptures, in violation of them (Matthew 15:3).
- They were self-righteous (Luke 18:9).
- They served God for human praise and recognition (Matthew 6:1).
- They were murderers, and sinned by putting Jesus to death (John 19:11).
- They were condemned for a failure to recognize truth (Matthew 21:27).
- Pharisees wielded their power to hinder the faith of others (John 12:42).
- Far from being condemned for obeying the Law too closely, they were actually called by Jesus for not obeying the Law correctly.
