Relationship Problems

- James describes a scenario in which a man with expensive clothes is given preferential treatment in the worship assembly, while a bedraggled poor man is conveniently shooed into a corner (James 2:1ff).
- If 1st Century Jews and Gentiles were expected to overcome their hurdles to church unity and building relationships (Galatians 3:28, 2:11ff, Romans 15:7) then so are we.
- The church in Corinth faced an uphill battle because of their tendency to divide into camps (1 Corinthians 1:10ff).
