AN AUDIENCE OF ONE



- Worship is almost always a verb in the NT, not a noun (John 4:21-24, Revelation 5:14, John 9:38, Matt. 2:2).
- How would you have felt participating in the REVELATION worship scene? Bored? Eager to leave? Have we forgotten one of the primary purposes of worship (Hebrews 10:24)?

ORSHIP

 Does our worship provoke any change in us (Luke 5:8)?

IS CHRIST INVITED TO WORSHIP?

- Revelation 3:15-20
- It is never God's fault when He is shut out, since He is omnipresent (Ps. 139:7ff). Do we invite Him into our congregation? Or our lives?
- Does it mean anything to sing about Christ without singing to Him? Or eating emblems without partaking of Christ (1 Cor. 11:17ff)?

"The Lord is in His holy temple, let all the earth keep silent before Him" HABAKKUK 2:20

HORIZONTAL WORSHIP

- Much of our attention is focused on the other worshipers, or the distractions around us. Disunity results when we come together with various, earthly goals (Col. 3:14-17).
- Horizontal worship puts the focus on the superficial components of worship, rather than our Lord.
- Revelation 4:2-11 puts God in the center, the only audience member.
