"God from all eternity did by the most wise and holy counsel of his own will freely and unchangeably ordain whatsoever comes to pass... By the decree of God, for the manifestation of his glory, some men and angels are predestined unto life, and others foreordained to everlasting death. These angels and men, thus predestined and foreordained, are particularly and unchangeably designed; and their number is so certain and definite that it cannot be either increased or diminished" (The Confession Of Faith Of The Presbyterian Church, USA, Chapter 111, "Of God's Eternal Decree").

"I most certainly understand now that God is not one to show partiality, but in every nation the man who fears Him and does what is right, is welcome to Him"

-Acts 10:34-35

- Ephesians 1:3-5 Not personal identification, but character and quality are predestined. Free will is built in to the context (vv. 12-13). What is predetermined is salvation through the work of Christ (vv. 9-10, 13-14).
- Acts 4:27-28 The plan was predestined. Anybody who becomes a citizen of Christ's kingdom becomes part of something that was planned long ago (1 Corinthians 2:6-8).
- Romans 8:29-30 We are not individually, selectively predestined, but our conformity to Christ is.
- Also, foreknowing is not the same as foreordaining. God may foreknow something without making it happen. Obedience is still not canceled out (1 Peter 1:2).

PREDESTINATION IN THE BIBLE

FOREKNOWLEDGE MEANS GOD **KNOWS WHAT WILL HAPPEN** (WITHOUT NECESSARILY BEING THE CAUSE OF IT) **PREDESTINATION MEANS A CERTAIN** PLAN, STRUCTURE, OR EXPECTATION HAS BEEN PREDETERMINED (AND FREE WILL ULTIMATELY DETERMINES YOUR PLACE IN THAT PLAN)

GOD IS NOT SELECTIVE OR PARTIAL

- God desires all to be saved (2 Peter 2:9, Titus 2:11-12, 1 Timothy 2:3-6).
- If salvation has already been determined, and the number of those saved "cannot be either increased or diminished", what is the purpose of this life? Why not skip it and go straight to eternity? Actually, Jesus clearly teaches that the actions of this life determine eternal destination (Matthew 25:31ff, John 5:28-29).
- The devil is not a serious threat if predestination is true (1 Peter 5:8-10).
- We are, indeed, called according to God's purpose, but not by a "still small voice" or God's individual selection; by the Gospel (2 Thessalonians 2:14).
