

HOPE OF HIS FALING EPHESIANS 1:18-20

- You don't have to look far to find a reason to be cranky today. It's easy to blame outside forces for your bitterness and cynicism, or your lost dreams. Whether it's something that has a tangible impact on you (a boss, malpractice, traffic) or is more abstract (culture, politics, the future), you will always be able to find somebody or something else to blame.
- Do you want to be mad at the world? Anger, vengeance, and selfpity are incredibly alluring and self-gratifying feelings. It is our natural response – in the same way that scratching a mosquito bite feels so good.

 Remember, your first instinct is not necessarily your best (Ecc. 7:9, Prov. 15:18, 29:11, James 4:1-2). It might feel "right" in the moment to run someone off the road, but...

REASONS TO BE MAD

- As long as there is money, there will be people who do anything to get it (Ecc. 4:4). There will also be people who lose it or are born into unfortunate circumstances (Matthew 26:11).
- As long as there are positions of power to be had, people will abuse them. Government is corrupt. Don't be shocked (Ecc. 5:8).
- Racism will always exist.
- Sickness will always exist.
- Businesses fail. Investments are lost. Banks crash. Markets tank.
- Wicked people are a forgone conclusion (Matt. 5:10-12).
- Be careful what you say, because it could always get worse. Remember, the world has been bad enough to warrant near-total devastation (Gen. 6:5-8).

WHAT CAN I CONTROL?

The path to joy is found in learning to control what you can – yourself. If you're waiting around for other people to change or for conditions to be perfect, get ready for a long wait!

- The Ephesian letter applies this concept to a number of different situations that are still relevant.
- 4:1-3 Walk in a worthy manner with humility and patience. This calm approach to our challenges will differentiate us from the world.
- 4:29-32 No unwholesome speech, but only edification. Do you speak with such discipline and circumspection with the people who annoy you? Politicians? Bad neighbors? A boss? A spouse?
- 5:22ff Speaking of spouses, your responsibility is yours! If Christ loved us the way we sometimes "love" each other...
- 6:1-9 Parents, children, workers, employers.
- 3:14-21 Optimism pervades the life of one who has the hope of God's calling.
